EARLY DEVELOPMENT

Smith (1977) states Human geography as a traditionally empirical subject, deeply rooted in the reality of life and analyzes spatial relationships in human – environmental affairs. In this aspect human geography is regarded as the study of who gets what, where and how.

This study aimed at describing and interpreting human phenomena as it changed from time – to – time and from place – to – place.

In the recent years, Human geography as a scientific discipline has undergone radical changes incorporating analysis of spatial relations using statistical processes and undertaking theoretical studies of human – environmental interrelations.
